

Willenhall based will writer Jim Stanistreet, from BensonWilliams, on secret trusts and half secret trusts



This job can get a bit murky sometimes.

Let's say I've got a client called William. He's married to Kate but has been having an extra marital affair, and now has a secret love child who Kate knows nothing about. As the father he wants to leave a sum of money in his will to the child, but he doesn't want Kate to discover what has happened. He is also acutely aware that if he doesn't leave the child anything in his will then the child's mother will claim against the estate and Kate definitely will find out what has gone on.

So, what can William do? One option is a "secret trust". In this scenario William leaves a sum of money in his will to a third party, let's say his brother Harry, and simultaneously enters into a private agreement with Harry that the money is actually meant for the child. This can work, but it does invest a lot of faith in Harry who could very easily keep the money for himself (which in turn would mean the child's mother claiming and Kate learning the truth). Also, we don't know what Harry's personal circumstances are going to be when William dies. He could be facing bankruptcy, or be in the middle of a complex divorce, or be in residential care, all of which could inadvertently expose the money to attack from external forces.

A second option is a "half secret trust". In this scenario William leaves a sum of money to the trustees of his will, and also states in the will that the money "is to be used for the purposes already agreed by me with my trustees". This is probably a lot safer in terms of ensuring that the money ultimately finds its way to the child. However, without being specific, it does also alert Kate to the fact that something has been happening.

I have to say it is extremely rare for me to be asked to draft something on behalf of a client and also be asked to keep it a secret from their husband or wife. Camouflaging things from other family members is more common, but happily the vast majority of my clients have absolutely nothing to hide and are just using me to ensure that their assets pass to their loved ones with the minimum of fuss and unnecessary expense.



Wildlife in Wednesfield

Despite the very cold snowy garden that I am sitting looking at this morning, I know for sure that spring is just around the corner.

Walking along the footpath across the Linthouse fields the other day I was met with a display of crocuses by the turnstile and then serenaded by male skylarks, meadow pipits and the excited calls of buzzards soaring in the warm thermals. Along the old railway line towards Ashmore Park, blackbirds and song thrushes were trying out their spring songs and blue, great and long-tailed tits were all doing whatever it is they spend their time doing. It was a very pleasant walk and I was joined, for a few delightful minutes by a Wood Mouse, whom I suppose didn't notice me standing still and quietly. The mouse pottered around in the leaf litter, took a sniff of my boot and then vanished again to look for small things to eat.

So, mice! Not everyone's favourite mammal, particularly not the incontinent House Mouse. However, that mouse is not native, unlike the Wood Mouse, Yellow-necked Mouse, Dormouse and, possibly, the Harvest Mouse all of which much prefer the great outdoors.

By far the most common of our native mice is the Wood Mouse and the one you are most likely to see when walking along country paths, particularly near hedges and woods. Small, hazel to dark brown on top with a white underbelly and very long tail they are easy to see. Just stand quietly near piles of leaf litter and keep your eyes and ears open.

Yellow-necked Mice are similar in appearance to Wood Mice, but 15-20% larger with a yellow collar under their chins. I've not seen Yellow-necked



mice locally, but they can be found on Wenlock Edge. Yellow-necked Mice are very feisty and will certainly bite you if you try to pick them up – you've been warned!

Near to Wenlock Edge our third mouse species can be found, the impossibly cute Dormouse.

Dormice have been badly affected by segmentation of their habitat by roads and are classified as rare and vulnerable to extinction in the UK.

They are one of the few native species of mammals that hibernate, along with hedgehogs and most bat species.

And then finally we have the Harvest Mouse.

Another 'cute as a button' mouse, which we are not really sure if it's native, but current thought is that it is. We know that it's been here for a very long time, but there is no pre-agricultural evidence of its existence in our islands. This may of course be because, being so small, there just isn't any evidence to find.

Harvest mice are very small and the only UK mammal with a prehensile tail, which it uses to anchor itself to grass and flower stems. They classed as vulnerable in Wales and critical in Scotland, but of least concern in England.



These days, they favour reed beds and thick undergrowth and make a

round nest from grasses and reeds placed close to the ground.

Well, that's it for this issue, so don't forget to look up, look down, look all around and keep enjoying our wildlife.

Wolves Foundation Our History

Wolves Foundation began life as Wolves in the Community in 1991, thanks largely to the work of the late Baroness Rachael Heyhoe-Flint, a pioneering cricketer who also had a spell as a Wolves director and club vice-president. Rachael was in charge of the public relations at the club and would arrange for players to carry out visits in the community.

In 2008, we became a registered charity as Wolves Community Trust, gradually increasing the number and range of our projects. We then rebranded as the Wolves Foundation in 2017 and have continued to expand our programme of activities ever since, with over 40 different projects now running throughout the city.

About us

Wolves Foundation is a cornerstone of the city of Wolverhampton. Through a team of highly skilled, dedicated staff and volunteers it harnesses the strong local connection with Wolves to motivate, educate and inspire tens of thousands of beneficiaries of its work across the city.

The charity works in partnership with key local stakeholders including the local authority, police, health service and education providers to identify risk factors in the city around societal issues and health status; using data and insight to deliver evidence-based practice through its vast array of projects that address these needs through its key three objectives;

- · Healthier, more active people
- Lifelong learning and skills
- Safer, stronger communities

Working in the community is vital to its work and removing barriers to engagement regardless of age, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, or disability. With participants ranging from 1 month to 100 years old across 225 different delivery sites in the city, work is delivered all year round improving the physical and mental health, personal development and life choices of the people engaged in its work. Data from its last 12 months work shows;

- 92% of participants have improved their mental and physical wellbeing
- 90% of participants have improved their educational achievement
- 84% of participants feel they now contribute more to a safer, stronger, more inclusive community.

Fairtrade Partnership

Wolves Foundation have given their support to Fairtrade Fortnight, an awareness campaign promoting better prices, decent working conditions and fair terms of trade for farmers and workers in the developing world.

For over 20 years now, Fairtrade campaigners have played a crucial role in calling for a fairer, greener and more sustainable future for food, and this two week spell, starting today, encourages and reminds people that, even at a local level, their actions can make a positive impact on a global scale.

That is why Wolves Foundation have – for the first time – decided to join the campaign, partnering up with Wolverhampton Fairtrade Partnership who were the first in the country to be awarded Fairtrade status by the Fairtrade Foundation, an accolade they have now held for 19 years.

"Fairtrade is a really important initiative where, if you buy food and drink from Fairtrade, part of that money is used to help farmers in the countries producing the products to improve their lives," says Wolves Foundation's Senior Schools Officer Marnie Richards.

"It can help them receive a fair income, as well as being invested into community projects in their local areas such as transport, water supply and schools and education.

"It also helps the environment because farmers who sell Fairtrade products must follow certain guidelines such as improving soil and water quality, avoiding using harmful chemicals and reducing their greenhouse gas emissions. "You can buy Fairtrade products all the year around but this fortnight is about bringing together local businesses and organisations to raise awareness and celebrate the positives."

The Wolverhampton Fairtrade Partnership was initially set up by former MP Lord Bilston Dennis Turner, and current chair Julia Farrell recently visited Molineux to confirm the new partnership. Julia met with Marnie and Wolves Foundation Schools' Officer Jeevan Kang, who has also been leading on a special project which will conclude during Fairtrade Fortnight.

"Jeev has been delivering a Fairtrade workshop via a six-part programme at Stowlawn Primary School which will then finish, here at Molineux, on March 1st," added Marnie.

"This will include fun activities such as football sessions, Fairtrade workshops and a tour of the Stadium."

So, if you're feeling stressed out or down, make sure to get outside and take a deep breath of fresh air. You'll be surprised at how much better you feel!



Pasta Sauces of Rome

Carbonara

Carbonara has grown incredibly popular in the UK.

First and foremost, it's crucial that we establish that pasta carbonara does not include cream. The basic formula is pasta alla gricia, plus egg.



The amount and ratio of whole eggs to egg yolks varies from chef to chef and nonna to nonna, but all authentic recipes include just cheese, egg, and guanciale. Carbonara can be just slightly trickier than gricia or cacio e pepe due to the finicky nature of egg-thickened sauces. Sadly, many discouraged cooks find themselves with a pan full of pasta and scrambled eggs... Emulsions can be elusive things.

Adding the egg right into a hot pan is, by nature, flirting with disaster; the delicate egg with cheese can't withstand the heat and breaks up into its disparate parts. But fear not, we can use an insurance policy (similar to that deployed with the pasta recipes above) against this misfortune. First, we will form an emulsion of egg and cheese, with a little splash of water, in a bowl. And then we toss the hot, guanciale-coated pasta vigorously in the bowl to avoid direct heat. The residual heat from the pasta and rendered fat will cook the egg gently and leave you with an impossibly velvety sauce.

Ingredients:

8 ounces dried pasta – spaghetti, linguine, tagliatelle, fettucine

4 ounces guanciale or smoked lardons or streak bacon, diced

1 ounce Parmesan cheese (plus more for serving), grated

1 ounce Pecorino-Romano cheese, grated

1 large egg

1 large egg yolk

Freshly cracked black pepper, to taste

Method

- Boil pasta in a pot of heavily salted water for about 2 minutes less than the package directions recommend.
- 2 Add the diced bacon to a large skillet and place the pan over medium-low heat. Saute until the fat has rendered and the guanciale is crisp.
- 3 Meanwhile, in a large, heat-proof bowl, add both cheeses, black pepper, egg, egg yolk, and a splash of cold water; mix vigorously.
- 4 Drain pasta, reserving about 2 cups of pasta water.
- 5 Add drained pasta to the pan with the guanciale and toss a few times to coat in the fat.
- 6 Dump pasta into the large bowl with the cheese and egg mixture and toss vigorously, adding in more pasta water as needed to achieve desired consistency.
- 7 Taste, adjust seasoning, and serve topped with more Parmesan



The Full Monty

Even after four decades, green-fingered expert Monty Don's passion for the outdoors shows little sign of waning, as he explains why gaining new inspiration is so important.

A lifetime of getting green fingers might be taking its toll physically on the 67-year-old broadcaster and writer Monty Don: aside from his bout of peritonitis in 2007, a stroke that could have killed him a year

later, and battles with depression – for which he says gardening has been a better antidote than any prescription drug – the everyday rigours of flowering and weeding, pruning and digging have left his body as weathered as one would expect... not that he cares.

"It's a strange day when you put the visual appearance of

your garden over yourself," he laughs. "For me, that was quite some time ago, but it all relates back to how passionate you are about a subject or a project.

"It's a big job to keep my garden how I want it, and to keep going – you do that because it's important not only for the future, but in respecting the effort you have put in previously."

A renowned writer on all things horticultural since the early 1990s, Don has had over 20 books published and still pens a number of popular newspaper columns.

He became the welcoming, enthusiastic, all-knowing expert on the BBC's Gardeners' World programme between 2003 and 2008, before taking on lead presenting duties for its flagship Chelsea Flower Show in 2014.



Well dressed in his 'painterly' style and with a sparkling demeanour, Monty's garden at Longmeadow in Herefordshire has become something of a national horticultural staple, with fans sharing in the ups and downs of tending to an expansive plot that continues to throw up new challenges. "We've had all manner of issues over the past few years, especially some drainage issues.

"Where nature is concerned, you've got to expect the unexpected – it's a fun part of the process... at least, fixing it is!"

When asked about his own inspirations, he admits to having been influenced by

the style and aesthetics of French gardener Nicole de Vesian, who passed away in 1996.

"Nicole had a great feeling for both colour and form, and then for space," he says. "Her use of colours could look muted and faded at first, but when her

gardens were in bloom they looked fantastic when the sun is shining. And she used the space in between plants and sculptures better than anyone. That's been a blueprint I've used for Longmeadow for quite some time.

"I think it's important to have heroes and inspiration, no matter who you are or for how long you've been in the game."

Memories of Our Wednesfield

Local Historian Ray Fellows looks back at Wednesfield Market



'Wednesfield Market off to a Flyer', those were the headlines in our local paper in the early 1960s.



After some delay-unavoidable, but none the less, frustrating issues - Tuesday, 13th December 1960 saw the long-awaited market open. The orderly rows of little stalls, with their gaily stripped awnings, lent an air of bright cheerfulness to the atmosphere of Christmas. The market site was across the road from the Regal in Alfred Squire Road.

Some traders at the time were F. Bonser & Son, hardware glass and china, Hilda Peach, curtains and dress materials, Birch's footwear, O. J. Edwards, high class butcher, O. Downes, fruit and veg, Holyhead soap powders and detergent, W. H. Jervis, poultry eggs and farm produce. If you were looking for top class meat with good service and reasonable prices Brian was the man.

Other traders were, Pauline's, toys and fancy goods, Fred's for groceries and toilet

requisites, F. Wesson, children's wear, Irene Marsh, sweets, chocolates, fancy goods and handbags. Doug Holden, groceries and pet foods, Brazier's home grown produce, eggs and poultry, and finally A. H. Painter nurseryman and florist.

Do you recall buying from these traders around 1965? If you are old enough, you would have shopped on the market back then.

In the 1970s the market moved to a new site on land by the council offices.

In the 1990s the market moved yet again this time into the high street and people were of the opinion that this would increase the number of traders and more shoppers would use the market, initially it did work but now the market today is sadly in decline, in January of this year, 2023 on one of the Saturdays only 3 stalls were occupied, the same happened in February.

Something needs to be done to attract more traders which in turn will attract more shoppers. What is happening to our market?

One reason could be that the younger generation are not interested in doing any shopping from the market as they buy goods online or go shopping around places like Bentley Bridge or other retail outlets.

Penkridge market does well, plenty of trader's lots of shoppers and it is the same with Bridgnorth market, Bilston market



celebrated being open for 50 years on March 12th of this year.

There is still a place for markets today, but our market needs help. Willenhall market is the same as ours, few traders and few shoppers, so we need to do something to save our market because if we don't then we may lose it.

One of the market's main traders is John Allen, his key cutters stall is there in all weathers, so he is dependable and you get a good friendly service from someone who has been on the market for years. Surely people must realise that we need people like John and his key cutter stall as he provides a really good local service to the folk of Wednesfield.

So, what can we do to get the market up and running again like it used to be in the 1960s?

Well, my suggestions would be to attract new traders by offering rent free stalls on Tuesday and Wednesdays for all traders, this would have a good chance of attracting new traders to our market, new traders would mean more shoppers, at the moment that would not cost much as there are not a lot of traders on those days.

Open up the High Street for traffic because on some mornings traffic coming over Gregory's bridge into Neachells Lane is queueing back nearly to Woodend Island. Widen the road by Barclays Bank old building that then would help the traffic in the High Street, it's hardly a pedestrian area because you have a bus going through every few minutes and taxi's most of the time.

Well, I have said it before and I will say it again please use the market let's not lose another part of our history, the market has been open for 63 years let's make sure that it continues for another 63 years.

The History Society was formed by myself and Simon Hamilton in 2009, we held meetings firstly at the Vine then the Pyle Cock, later our meetings were held at the Nickelodeon and then at the Royal British Legion club, and now it seems that we have gone full circle and ended up back at the Vine after 14 years
