Willenhall based will writer Jim Stanistreet, from BensonWilliams, on secret trusts and half secret trusts



This job can get a bit murky sometimes.

Let's say I've got a client called William. He's married to Kate but has been having an extra marital affair, and now has a secret love child who Kate knows nothing about. As the father he wants to leave a sum of money in his will to the child, but he doesn't want Kate to discover what has happened. He is also acutely aware that if he doesn't leave the child anything in his will then the child's mother will claim against the estate and Kate definitely will find out what has gone on.

So, what can William do? One option is a "secret trust". In this scenario William leaves a sum of money in his will to a third party, let's say his brother Harry, and simultaneously enters into a private agreement with Harry that the money is actually meant for the child. This can work, but it does invest a lot of faith in Harry who could very easily keep the money for himself (which in turn would mean the child's mother claiming and Kate learning the truth). Also, we don't know what Harry's personal circumstances are going to be when William dies. He could be facing bankruptcy, or be in the middle of a complex divorce, or be in residential care, all of which could inadvertently expose the money to attack from external forces.

A second option is a "half secret trust". In this scenario William leaves a sum of money to the trustees of his will, and also states in the will that the money "is to be used for the purposes already agreed by me with my trustees". This is probably a lot safer in terms of ensuring that the money ultimately finds its way to the child. However, without being specific, it does also alert Kate to the fact that something has been happening.

I have to say it is extremely rare for me to be asked to draft something on behalf of a client and also be asked to keep it a secret from their husband or wife. Camouflaging things from other family members is more common, but happily the vast majority of my clients have absolutely nothing to hide and are just using me to ensure that their assets pass to their loved ones with the minimum of fuss and unnecessary expense.

Dozens of Jobs to be Created after Willenhall Haulage Firm's Expansion Gets Green Light



New jobs will be created after a haulage firm's plan to expand its Willenhall operation was given the go-ahead.

RK Transport Services Ltd will take over a former scrap yard site next to its existing commercial

building on Temple Bar to boost the business which has been there for more than four decades. The expansion will see the creation of five new jobs to add to the 55-strong workforce with the potential for five more being created in two years time.

Work will involve demolishing an existing commercial building as well as extending RK Transport's workshop.

Agents CT Planning said: "The northern portion of the site is occupied by RK Transport Services Ltd. who have operated from this location for over 40 years.

"The southern part of the site was formerly occupied by a scrapyard, which has now ceased to operate. "RK Transport Services Ltd are looking to expand their operations into the southern portion of the site to support the expansion of an existing business and strengthen the economic vitality of the surrounding area.

"It is acknowledged that there is a wider shortage of housing land within the Black Country, however the same is true for employment land and as such this must be considered when weighing up the material considerations and benefits of this application.

"The site is not an allocated housing site and there is currently no prospect of housing being delivered on the land. "The proposed expansion of the existing business will generate an additional five full-time jobs immediately (and the potential of a further five full-time jobs in two years) that will help to meet the needs of local communities. "The generation of employment opportunities within the site are encouraged by local and national policy and local policy states that the retention of existing employment sites will be supported.

"It is considered that the expansion of an existing business in this location will achieve both of these goals as it will provide essential employment opportunities at this time and also retains an established site that is intended for employment use. "The proposed development would also allow for the retention of 55 full-time jobs."

R K Transport was formed approx 30 yrs ago by Ray Kibble, when Ray started out as an owner driver working long and hard hours to make ends meet.

During his time as owner driver he made some good contacts and soon found that he needed another vehicle to cover the work...... the rest is history, from one to two to three, four and so on, to it became obvious that his time was best spent in the office and looking after customers, whilst employing professional drivers to do the driving.

During the next 25 years the company has grown within an expansion plan to where it is today, running a fleet of some 50 vehicles, with the second generation of Kibbles pushing the company forward.

The Full Monty

Even after four decades, green-fingered expert Monty Don's passion for the outdoors shows little sign of waning, as he explains why gaining new inspiration is so important.

A lifetime of getting green fingers might be taking its toll physically on the 67-year-old broadcaster and writer Monty Don: aside from his bout of peritonitis in 2007, a stroke that could have killed him a year

later, and battles with depression – for which he says gardening has been a better antidote than any prescription drug – the everyday rigours of flowering and weeding, pruning and digging have left his body as weathered as one would expect... not that he cares.

"It's a strange day when you put the visual appearance of

your garden over yourself," he laughs. "For me, that was quite some time ago, but it all relates back to how passionate you are about a subject or a project.

"It's a big job to keep my garden how I want it, and to keep going – you do that because it's important not only for the future, but in respecting the effort you have put in previously."

A renowned writer on all things horticultural since the early 1990s, Don has had over 20 books published and still pens a number of popular newspaper columns.

He became the welcoming, enthusiastic, all-knowing expert on the BBC's Gardeners' World programme between 2003 and 2008, before taking on lead presenting duties for its flagship Chelsea Flower Show in 2014.



Well dressed in his 'painterly' style and with a sparkling demeanour, Monty's garden at Longmeadow in Herefordshire has become something of a national horticultural staple, with fans sharing in the ups and downs of tending to an expansive plot that continues to throw up new challenges. "We've had all manner of issues over the past few years, especially some drainage issues.

"Where nature is concerned, you've got to expect the unexpected – it's a fun part of the process... at least, fixing it is!"

When asked about his own inspirations, he admits to having been influenced by

the style and aesthetics of French gardener Nicole de Vesian, who passed away in 1996.

"Nicole had a great feeling for both colour and form, and then for space," he says. "Her use of colours could look muted and faded at first, but when her

gardens were in bloom they looked fantastic when the sun is shining. And she used the space in between plants and sculptures better than anyone. That's been a blueprint I've used for Longmeadow for quite some time.

"I think it's important to have heroes and inspiration, no matter who you are or for how long you've been in the game."



What does a dental hygienist do?

A dental hygienist cleans teeth by removing plaque from tooth surfaces using special tools and techniques. They may also remove tartar (calcified deposits) and polish teeth to improve their appearance. They may sometimes work closely with dentists or orthodontists to address issues related to tooth decay or gum disease.

You should consider using a dental hygienist if you suffer from gingivitis or periodontal disease. These conditions cause inflammation of the gums and bone around the teeth. Regular visits to a hygienist can help treat these problems. However, it may be too late by then for your mouth to heal completely. A dental hygienist will be able to detect any signs of gum disease before your condition worsens.





How can I make my hygienist visits less..... painful?

It's important to maintain good oral hygiene. Brushing and flossing regularly help reduce the risk of developing fillings and periodontal disease. To avoid these conditions, make sure to brush and floss after meals and at bedtime. When brushing, focus on areas where food collects. For example, try to reach into spaces between your teeth and along the gum line. Also, pay attention to the back sides of your molars.

Flossing helps remove bacteria and debris that collect around your teeth. Use an interdental cleaner to gently loosen plaque and food particles. Then, carefully slide the floss between your teeth to remove the material.

Brush your tongue too! Tongue cleaning is another effective method of keeping your mouth healthy. Brush your tongue with a soft-bristled toothbrush, making sure to brush all parts of it.

It's important to keep up with routine dental exams. Your dentist will examine your teeth and gums during each visit. During this time, he or she will also take X-rays to determine whether you need additional treatments.

If you're not sure when your next dental exam is due, contact your dentist's office.

Lend With Care

For a loan as little £15, individuals and organisations can help to get people started in small businesses and receive news on how the business is developing and then see the repayment of the loan as the business succeeds.

From an initial investment of £210 in 2019 these past four years has seen that grow to £660. The Rotary Club has helped create 201 jobs in countries as diverse as Malawi, Zambia and Zimbabwe a well as the Philippines, Pakistan, Peru and Palestine.

Over 514 entrepreneurs have received help from the loans and 1785 family members have received support from the scheme.

'Lend with Care' is run on behalf of the Rotary Club by twice Past President Jim Green who says, "We are one of the many Rotary Clubs who support 'Lend with Care' and are very proud of the fact that a relatively small club like ours can help so many people and families out of poverty around the world.

Pasta Sauces of Rome

Carbonara

Carbonara has grown incredibly popular in the UK.

First and foremost, it's crucial that we establish that pasta carbonara does not include cream. The basic formula is pasta alla gricia, plus egg.



The amount and ratio of whole eggs to egg yolks varies from chef to chef and nonna to nonna, but all authentic recipes include just cheese, egg, and guanciale. Carbonara can be just slightly trickier than gricia or cacio e pepe due to the finicky nature of egg-thickened sauces. Sadly, many discouraged cooks find themselves with a pan full of pasta and scrambled eggs... Emulsions can be elusive things.

Adding the egg right into a hot pan is, by nature, flirting with disaster; the delicate egg with cheese can't withstand the heat and breaks up into its disparate parts. But fear not, we can use an insurance policy (similar to that deployed with the pasta recipes above) against this misfortune. First, we will form an emulsion of egg and cheese, with a little splash of water, in a bowl. And then we toss the hot, guanciale-coated pasta vigorously in the bowl to avoid direct heat. The residual heat from the pasta and rendered fat will cook the egg gently and leave you with an impossibly velvety sauce.

Ingredients:

8 ounces dried pasta – spaghetti, linguine, tagliatelle, fettucine

4 ounces guanciale or smoked lardons or streak bacon, diced

1 ounce Parmesan cheese (plus more for serving), grated

1 ounce Pecorino-Romano cheese, grated

1 large egg

1 large egg yolk

Freshly cracked black pepper, to taste

Method

- Boil pasta in a pot of heavily salted water for about 2 minutes less than the package directions recommend.
- 2 Add the diced bacon to a large skillet and place the pan over medium-low heat. Saute until the fat has rendered and the guanciale is crisp.
- 3 Meanwhile, in a large, heat-proof bowl, add both cheeses, black pepper, egg, egg yolk, and a splash of cold water; mix vigorously.
- 4 Drain pasta, reserving about 2 cups of pasta water.
- 5 Add drained pasta to the pan with the guanciale and toss a few times to coat in the fat.
- 6 Dump pasta into the large bowl with the cheese and egg mixture and toss vigorously, adding in more pasta water as needed to achieve desired consistency.
- 7 Taste, adjust seasoning, and serve topped with more Parmesan

Willenhall Gets Levelling up Boost

It was confirmed in January that Walsall Council's bid for £20m of Levelling Up Fund Round 2 (LUF2) for Willenhall has been successful.

The development of Willenhall Garden City in Walsall will be accelerated by this grant, which will play a key role in unlocking a £210 million regeneration plan, enabling the delivery of new homes, parks, and a railway station.

A total of 111 areas out of over 550 across the UK have been awarded funding from LUF2 and Willenhall is one of just eight successful bids across the wider West Midlands area.

Councillor Adrian Andrew, Deputy Leader of Walsall Council said:

"This is a new beginning for Willenhall and an opportunity to look to a future of a more positive vibrant and successful Willenhall. The Love Willenhall Masterplan was launched and developed precisely to secure external funding like this and as someone involved in shaping this policy since day one I am incredibly proud of this achievement. This is the largest injection of funding in Willenhall in over 40 years and it shows that our commitment to regeneration in Willenhall in a real sense and not just in cosmetic changes is strong and on track. We will deliver a safer stronger cleaner greener Willenhall.

"I look forward to welcoming the Secretary of State to Willenhall to discuss our plans in more detail and show him around to see for himself the positive changes we're planning.

"This was a competitive process and our success wouldn't have happened without the sterling work of a small but very dedicated team of regeneration officers and I'm very grateful to them for their hard work." The Walsall North LUF2 £20m bid proposals focus on works to enable around 106 new homes at Moat Street and Villiers Street and highway improvements to promote active travel,



creating attractive spaces for communities to live and work.

The proposals fit within the overarching vision and objectives set within the Willenhall Framework Plan will accelerate housing and economic growth opportunities following the investment in the new rail station.

The Moat Street/Villiers Street scheme in Willenhall is the first phase of a wider housing-led programme to enable delivery of over 500 new homes in the Framework Plan area. The LUF2 bid will enable the delivery of circa 106 new high-quality homes, including new affordable homes, family-focused housing and an improved street scene.

The movement element is focused on improving active travel and connectivity between the rail station, district centre, green spaces and residential and employment areas:

- The Greenway cycle/pedestrian route that runs east-west on the former railway line from St Anne's Road to Willenhall Memorial Park and employment areas.
- Railway Lane north-south active travel route between Willenhall Trading Estate and the town centre.
- Rosehill/Bilston Lane junction new 3-armed roundabout to increase capacity and reduce congestion.

I'm delighted to announce that the Levelling Up Bid for Willenhall, submitted last year, has been approved! Willenhall is now set to receive multi-million-pound investment from the Government. This will transform Willenhall Town Centre by supporting Walsall Council's Willenhall Framework Plan which seeks to breathe new life into Willenhall by bringing derelict sites back into use, creating affordable homes for local families, all whilst making Willenhall a great place to live and work – and what better timing with Willenhall Railway Station reopening soon! I campaigned for investment into Willenhall before I was elected as your Member of Parliament in 2017 and I am delighted to be able to deliver on this pledge.

Having secured the £20m for Willenhall, I was pleased to welcome Michael Gove, the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to the town for an opportunity to meet with Council Officers to discuss the details of our plans for Willenhall in more detail. The Secretary of State was keen to hear about the plans for housing and investment whilst preserving the towns heritage. There is even more exciting news - The new Urgent and Emergency Care Centre at Walsall Manor Hospital is now open! The opening of the new centre will change the quality of care received by patients and the work environment for the wonderful staff. I'm looking forward to the "official" opening later this year.



You may have seen that the former Eagleworks site on Somerford Place is being demolished! I was pleased to join GreenSquareAccord at the site. The former factory is being turned into 51 homes for local families including one and two bed apartments as two, three and four bedroom houses. I'm pleased that the development will transform the unused and derelict site into sustainable homes. The demolition of this derelict site marks a new era for Willenhall as derelict sites are knocked down and more investment comes into our historic town.

I'm looking forward to keeping you updated on all these exciting projects and more progress is made and I'll see you out and about in the town!



As Prince of Wales, Charles has been preparing for this moment for most of his life, under the tutelage and guidance of his late mother, Elizabeth II. He will be recorded in history as the longest ever heir apparent, and the oldest to ever accede to the British throne at the age of 73.

Charles Philip Arthur George was born on 14th November 1948, during the reign of his grandfather King George VI. After the death of the King in 1952, his mother Elizabeth became Queen and Charles became heir to the throne at just three years old.

Charles was educated at Cheam and Gordonstoun schools, in the footsteps of his father Philip. He was the first heir apparent to attend school rather than receive private tuition. His time at Gordonstoun was hard, he referred to it as "Colditz in kilts" but later reflected, "...it taught me to accept challenges and take the initiative." He left in 1967 with six O levels and two A levels in French and History.

Charles went on to read Archaeology and Anthropology, then switched to History at Trinity College, Cambridge. He gained a 2:2 Bachelor of Arts in 1970. As Prince of Wales, he also spent a term at the University College in Aberystwyth, in order to study the Welsh language and history. In 1975, Cambridge University awarded him a Master of Arts. Charles joined the Royal Air Force and trained as a jet pilot, then the Royal Navy, where he qualified as a helicopter pilot. The Prince's Trust was founded in 1976 with the \pounds 7,500 severance pay from the Navy. Since then, Charles has established sixteen more charities which raise over £100 million annually.

In 1981, he married Lady Diana Spencer. They had two sons, William born in 1982 and Harry in 1984. The couple divorced in 1996, and Diana was tragically killed in a car accident a year later.

In 2005, Charles married Camilla Parker-Bowles. The official title of Princess of Wales was never publicly acknowledged, instead Camilla became known as the Duchess of Cornwall.

The Duchy of Cornwall Estate was established by Edward III in 1337 for the heir to the throne. As Duke of Cornwall, the 53,000 hectare estate provided Charles with a private income to fund public, charitable and private activities, effectively making him financially independent. The estate passed to Prince William when he became heir apparent.

On 8th September 2022, Queen Elizabeth passed away peacefully and King Charles III became the new monarch. Coronation plans have been laid out for many years, under the codename 'Operation Golden Orb'. It's thought that the service will be smaller than the last coronation in 1953, and include different faiths and communities to reflect the change in British society. The Church of England ceremony will be broadcast internationally, and requires an oath and anointment, delivery of the orb and enthronement. The coronation of King Charles III and Camilla takes place in Westminster Abbey on 6th May 2023. Long live the King!



Willenhall History The Hartills

We need to go back to the first quarter of the 17th century to discover the Hartill family, George born in Willenhall in 1638, son of Thomas and Elizabeth Hartill who married Isabel Cross b 1642 on 14th Feb 1663 at St Peter Wolverhampton. It is George's great- great- grandson Isacc Hartill born 1731 who married Mary Baker that took on the role of publican at the Neptune Inn in Walsall Street opposite St Giles Church, a former posting house but used regularly upstairs as a court room and with its spacious stable yard was used by farmers on Sundays, eventually becoming a very popular meeting place. After Isaac's death in 1820 his son Isaac Jr. born 1769 took over the inn. Isaac Jr. married Ann Hartill a descendent of another of George's sons.

It was Isaac's son Jeremiah who in 1826 having served his Indenture with Thomas Smyth, Surgeon, Apothecary and Man Midwife of Bilston that Dr Hartill established himself in medical practice. Jeremiah bought a house on the corner of Walsall Road and Birmingham Street from Thomas Taylor Lees. The practice prospered and so in 1847 Jeremiah decided to have the house demolished in order to have a larger and more suitable house built on the site, he named the house the "Manor House".



Two years later Dr Hartill and other doctors of the town worked tirelessly to save people during the Cholera Epidemic, caused by poor housing, lack of clean water and inadequate sanitation, almost 300 Willenhall people died because of it, nonetheless it fared better than the 1832 outbreak in Bilston where 742 people died, progression took time.

Two of Jerimiah's nephews William Henry born in 1838 and John Thomas born in 1847 were greatly influenced by their uncle Jeremiah, he never married but took these two boys under his wing and encouraged them to learn, study and enter the medical profession which they both did very successfully. William Henry joined the practice in 1861 and John Thomas in 1869.

The two brothers married two sisters, daughters of James Tildesley another name synonymous with Willenhall. Eventually William Henry had a house built to the left of the Manor House, he named it "Lonsdale House" and worked from there as a doctor and surgeon with his wife Louisa Elizabeth and family.

John Thomas continued working with his uncle until the 1880's when Jeremiah formerly retired moving to Wednesfield until his death in 1887 aged 83, nevertheless he was buried at St Giles Church. Two years later William Henry died unexpectedly aged just 50, he too was buried at St Giles on the 2nd September 1889.

John Thomas Hartill administered to the town and like his uncle he usually had medical students, assistants and assistant surgeons with him. He remained there till his death in 1913 aged 66, after which Emily and one daughter left the Manor House moving to Wolverhampton.
