

Darlaston Town FC are looking for their Oldest Former Player to be their VIP Guest at Historic Event

This year sees Midland Football League Premier Division Darlaston Town celebrate their 150th Anniversary.

Originally formed in 1874 the club has played in the Walsall Junior league, Birmingham Junior League, Birmingham Combination, Birmingham League. West Midlands (Regional) League and most recently the Midland Football League. The club celebrates 150 years this year and are looking to find their oldest former player to attend their celebratory Dinner Dance as their VIP Guest.

As part of the club's celebrations, they will be holding a celebratory Dinner and Dance at The Pavilion (formerly Goodyears), Stafford Road Wolverhampton on Friday 7 June 2024 starting at 7.00pm.

Tickets for the Dinner Dance which includes a 3 course meal, a top tribute act and disco are now on sale at £35pp. The club is hopeful that many former players, officials, volunteers and supporters will be part of this historic event. Anyone wishing to purchase tickets or know more about the event should contact organiser Peter Davies on 07847 829921.

It is expected to be the largest and most important off field event the club has organised in more than 70 years. The club is looking to get in touch with anyone who has any historical connection with the club either as a volunteer, club official, player or manager. Ahead of the event the club is looking to find the oldest former player to play for the club to be a VIP at the event. Club Chairman Neil Chambers said, "Over our 150 year history, thousands of players have represented the club and we are looking for a needle in a haystack by appealing to find the oldest former player to be our VIP Guest together with a family member/companion."

It is hard to say in which era the oldest living player will have played for us, but it is likely that they played for the club in the late1950s, 1960s or 1970s and will currently be in their late 80s or 90s. With that in mind they were likely managed by one of the following managers, Freddy Humpage, Guy Wharton (former Wolves and Portsmouth player), Jimmy Southam, Billy Harrison. Charlie Onions, Ken Betteridge, Billy Gutteridge (former Walsall player) Pat Foley, Alan Hawkes, Geoff Barnsley, Granville Palin (former Walsall player), Bill Pope, Terry Wharton (former Wolves player) or Mick Babb.

We are particularly appealing to the children, grandchildren and family members who knew that their dad, grandad or uncle played for the club and in recounting stories of their playing days may have mentioned who they played with and which manager they played for.

We are extremely hopeful that we will get a great response to our appeal to find the oldest player as well as for former players, officials, volunteers and supporters who may wish to attend this historic event. It would be wonderful to see as many former players, supporters and officials as possible to re-tell old stories and talk about the good old days". 

Is Barlow back... for good?

Following last year's release of their charttopping album *This Life,* Take That are ready to return to the stage with a show that promises to enthral. Naturally, their chief songwriter, Gary Barlow, couldn't be more excited.

In June 2023 the iconic pop group Take That announced a grand return to the stage with This Life On Tour – a spectacular 29-date journey across 15 cities, marking their first major outing since their hiatus between 2019 and 2023

All is set to begin in April with three opening nights in Sheffield and symbolises something of a renaissance for the band. Gary Barlow, the band's esteemed songwriter of 13 UK number one singles, shared his enthusiasm.

"There's an electric feeling about going back on tour, especially after such a relatively long break. This Life On Tour isn't just about performing our new songs; it's a celebration of

our journey, our fans and the music that has been part of so many lives," he said.

The tour is named after their current and ninth studio album This Life and to celebrate a fourth decade of music since they first appeared on the scene with 1991 debut single Do What U Like.

Featuring the lead single Windows, the album showcases a matured sound reflecting the band's evolution over the years.
Barlow describes it as being "filled with our experiences, hopes and memories. It's deeply personal yet universal. We've poured every bit of ourselves into this album"

The tour will not only cover major cities like Leeds, Dublin, London, Glasgow, Manchester and Birmingham but also includes several other UK landmarks, such as Plymouth, Swansea and Nottingham.

After the final UK date in Bristol on Saturday June 8th, the boys will move on to a series of shows in key European cities, including Berlin, Rome and Madrid. Reflecting on the band's journey and the excitement of touring again, the 53-year-old enthuses: "Every time we step on stage, it's a new adventure. The thrill of performing live, the energy from the crowd – it's irreplaceable. This tour, with our new music, feels like we're starting a fresh chapter and we can't wait to share it with everyone."

Known for their dynamic live performances and a string of

hits dating back to the 1990s, they are expected to deliver a mix of new tracks from This Life along with their classic hits, offering a full spectrum of their musical journey.

As Barlow puts it: "It's not just a tour; it's a thank you to our fans, a nod to our past and a toast to the future."



Deborah Hopkins an avid runner, grew up in Wednesbury and has happy memories of Brunswick Park. Having returned to Wednesbury for a family funeral she took a walk around the park and thought, "what a great venue for a Parkrun".

So the story begins..... back in February 2022 she contacted Ian 'Mac' McDermott, Chair of the Friends of Brunswick Park, to enquire if it would be possible to start a Parkrun?

So after a struggle to match diaries a meeting was held at the Sons of Rest, one snowy afternoon in March 2022, the plan was put together by Deb, Suzy Street-Hall, Mac and Jill.



After a long drawn-out process which included setting out the course, obtaining funding (with help from SCVO), discussions with Sandwell MBC and finding somewhere to store the equipment (thank you Colin James from the Sons of Rest).

We were finally in a position to have a meeting with other like-minded Park Runners and things

With the arrival of warmer weather and sunnier days, National Trust gardens and parks are a lovely way to spend time surrounded by nature. There's a wealth of properties across the West Midlands, and beyond, all with something different to offer. For visiting information and inspiration: www.nationaltrust.org.uk



Attingham Park, near Shrewsbury

See the estate spring to life with vibrant colours across the garden and parkland. Hyacinths, tulips, fruit tree blossom, apple blossom, daffodils and bluebells will all be in bloom at times during spring. In late spring the national collection of camassias will be in bloom. Towards the end of May we'll also see the rhododendrons, laburnum, azaleas in colour in the woodlands.

Biddulph Grange Garden, near Stoke-on-Trent

Explore the hidden treasures around Biddulph Grange Garden from quirky design features of Egyptian pyramids grown out of yew to tunnels, stepping stones and a trickling stream running through a Himalayan inspired Glen and the centrepiece of a Victorian Chinese Garden complete with golden buffalo, dragon sculptures and exotic plant collection.

Finish a visit with a traditional tea and scone in the former billiard room and pick up a plant to remember your visit from the plant centre.

Clent Hills, near Stourbridge

In spring, the Clent Hills burst to life with the sights, sounds and smells of nature. Bluebell valley becomes blanketed with an enormous number of flowers, blossom appears on trees and you can spot wildlife off the beaten track at Walton Hill. Take in the panoramic view from the four stones.

Dudmaston Estate, near Bridgnorth



Dudmaston comes to life in spring as blossom adorns the fruit trees in the orchard while spring flowers create a changing rainbow of colour in the Dingle. Spring is a time to enjoy the garden and to explore nature at Comer Woods.

Join a wellbeing walk through the trees or take part in the Trust 10, a 10k run through the woods. Dudmaston Hall and Galleries have recently reopened, offering a journey through some of the most iconic works of the British Modern Art Movement.

Kinver Edge and the Rock Houses, near Stourbridge

KXNKSHXME Release Their Debut Single




Local band KXNKSHXME (pronounced Kink Shame) have just released their debut single Baby Blue.



JAMIE'S £1 WONDERS

With the cost of food and energy on the rise, Jamie's £1 Wonders is all about delicious recipes that won't blow the budget, coming in at less than £1 a portion.

The aim of Jamie's £1 Wonders is to be as useful to people as possible, with all prices correct at the time of filming (September 2022 and January 2023).

Each recipe is priced at £1 or less per portion, which has been calculated based on an average of four UK

supermarkets (Tesco, Asda, Sainsbury's and Morrisons.

They've calculated the cost per portion by the amount used, rather than the whole ingredient cost, as it's assumed you'll already have many of the ingredients in your store cupboard/fridge/ freezer.

They don't include olive oil, salt or pepper in the final costings, as we think you'll have these already.

1kg chicken thighs, skin on, bone in

- 2 onions
- 2 tablespoons tikka masala curry paste
- 1 x 400g tin of plum tomatoes
- 1 mug of basmati rice (300g)
- 500g frozen peas
- 1×400 g tin of light coconut milk

ONE-PAN SPICY CHICKEN

SWEET ONIONS. PEAS & FLUFFY RICE

SERVES 6 | TOTAL TIME: 50 MINUTES | GLUTEN-FREE, DAIRY-FREE

- 1. Place a large casserole pan on a medium-high heat. Season the chicken thighs with a pinch of sea salt and plenty of black pepper, then place in the pan skin-side down for 10 minutes, or until browned, then use tongs to turn them over and carefully remove the chicken skin. Place it in the pan alongside the thighs, removing to a board once crisp, then roughly chop.
- **2.** Meanwhile, peel and finely chop the onions and add to the pan. Cook for 2 minutes, or until golden, then stir in the curry paste and cook for 10 minutes.
- 3. Tip in the tomatoes, breaking them up with a spoon, then cook for 5 minutes, until thickened.
- 4. Stir in the rice to toast for 1 minute or until translucent, then pour in 2 mugs of water (600ml). Give it a stir, turn over the chicken and cover with a lid. Leave to simmer for 12 minutes, or until the rice is cooked, stirring in the peas and most of the coconut milk for the final 2 minutes. When it's blipping away in the middle starting to catch at the edges, remove from the heat. Ripple through the remaining coconut milk, then divide between plates. Sprinkle over the crispy chicken skin and serve.
