Access to Business (A2B) is the Award-Winning Wolverhampton Charity providing Employment/Enterprise/Social Enterprise support together with Employability and Skills training, Health & Wellbeing programmes and H



A2B Celebrate its 20th Anniversary this year with lots of exciting new services planned including the upcoming opening of a new Pilot Social Enterprise Centre in Wolverhampton to support start-up Social Enterprises. Also planned is more Community Gardening Projects in the City following the success of the development of their new Community Garden at Bilston Craft Gallery.



A2B began in 2002 as a small project with 3 staff and registered as a Charity in 2004 In order to meet the growing demand for our services Access to Business secured a large Lottery grant in 2007 that supported the move to its current location in Tempest Street Wolverhampton and the services continued to grow as A2B expanded and currently 18 staff are employed providing services across the Borough of Wolverhampton. Wildlife in Wednesfield

With summer just round the corner and people taking trips out, weekends away and summer holidays, the heron family of birds might just start to pop up into view.

Back in the 60s when I was a child, and in the 70s in my teens, the only members of the heron family that could be seen were the Grey Heron and, if you were exceptionally lucky, the summer visitor, the Bittern.



The Bittern, although rarely seen, can be heard at this time of the year 'booming' as males establish territory and attract mates in vast reedbeds. It's an incredible sound and worth listening to on the internet. Bittern numbers are expanding and they are a real success story of conservation.

Today however, there are four other heron/egrets regularly breeding in the UK and all of them are largely white. They are the Little Egret, Great White Egret, Cattle Egret and Spoonbill and even though Little Egrets have bred here since 1996 I still get a buzz out of seeing them.

Little Egrets are by far the most numerous and widely distributed. Although I've not yet seen them on 'the cut' in Wednesfield, I did have one fly across the A41 in front of me following the River Cole in Tyseley, Birmingham on the 8th May this year! Little Egrets are much smaller than a Grey Heron, pure white and have black legs with distinctive yellow feet and long head plumes. They are now a common



site on pretty much any large body of water and in fields and ditches.

The Great White Egret really is a magnificent bird.

Although it's not quite as big as a Grey Heron, the first time you see one you can't help but think they are! Their size alone makes them readily distinguishable from Little Egrets, but their large yellow bill and elegant, slow movements are also recognisable features. Not as widespread as the Little Egret the Great White Egret is well established in the Midlands, particularly the East Midlands, but they are no longer an unusual site in our part of the world.



The other two birds I mentioned above, the Cattle Egret and the Spoonbill have a much more southerly range in the UK but are spreading northwards and are regularly seen on the West Midlands' bodies of water. Cattle Egrets are small, compact egrets and as their name suggests, are often seen close to livestock. Unlike Little Egrets, they have fairly short yellow/orange bills and yellow legs, and in the breeding season their white plumage develops orange patches.



And finally Spoonbills. Spoonbills to me are really exotic birds, but the only place I've ever seen them is in the UK! They are large and unmistakeable and have a real wow factor when you see them for the first time. Creamy white rather than white, but will long spoon shaped black bills and a yellow tip (pinkish bills in juveniles) and yellowy collars they really are a wonderful thing to see.

Well, that's it for this issue, so don't forget to look up, look down, look all around and keep enjoying our wildlife.

Life of Brian

Discover how Professor Brian Cox, renowned for seamlessly blending entertainment and science, has made his unique journey from musician to physicist.

Before delving into the cosmos, Brian Cox found fame in the early 1990s as the keyboard player for the British pop band D:REAM – best known for their hit Things Can Only Get Better.

Cox says: "Being in D:REAM was more than just making music; it was about conveying profound messages and evoking deep emotions in our audience, similar to what I strive to achieve in science communication. It's about connecting, engaging, and inspiring people, bridging the gap between art and science."

The 56-year-old's research at the Large Hadron Collider at CERN has contributed significantly to our understanding of fundamental particles and forces.

"Working at CERN felt like being an integral part of history in the making. Each discovery, each breakthrough, propelled us further into the depths of understanding, bringing us incrementally closer to unravelling the intricate and profound mysteries that constitute the very fabric of the universe."

Cox's knack for making complex scientific ideas accessible and intriguing propelled him to household name status. His collaboration with comedian Robin Ince on BBC Radio 4's podcast The Infinite Monkey Cage exemplifies this skill. Cox emphasises, "Science isn't just for scientists. Our aim with Monkey Cage is to make it as clear and entertaining as possible, a fundamental part of our culture."

His impact extends beyond radio, with several successful BBC television programs, including Wonders of the Solar System and Wonders of the Universe. These series have brought astrophysics into the living rooms of millions, igniting curiosity and wonder about the cosmos.

Reflecting on the impact of these programs, Oldham-born Cox says: "Those shows are more than just educational; they're a celebration of human curiosity and our relentless pursuit of understanding."



He says: "Horizons isn't just a lecture; it's a journey through the wonders of the universe,

> designed to inspire and amaze. My journey might seem unusual, but at their core, they're both about exploration and expression. Whether it's through a song or a lecture, the goal is to evoke wonder and understanding."

"The beauty of science lies in its ability to amaze and inspire. It's a never-ending journey of discovery, and I'm just fortunate to be a part of it."

Willenhall Based Will Writer Jim Stanistreet, from Bensonwilliams, Highlights How Second Marriages Can Affect Inheritances



The following is a true story which I did discuss in this magazine a couple of years ago. Due to the number of people who are in second marriages I still regularly find myself discussing it with clients today, as the problems it highlights are easily resolved by making straight forward Wills.

John and Ann Scarle, an elderly couple in a second marriage, each had one daughter from their first marriages. In October 2016 they were both found dead at their home in Leigh on Sea having died from hypothermia several days earlier. In cases where two people die together, or in circumstances where it is not possible to determine the orders of death, section 184 of The Law of Property Act 1925 states that, for estate administration purposes, the elder (in this case John) is deemed to die first, and the younger (in this case Ann) to die second. This meant that the entire estate (approximately £300,000) passed from John to Ann, and then on to Ann's next of kin being her daughter from her first marriage. Johns' daughter received nothing.

However, John's daughter fought back arguing that forensic evidence based on the rates of decomposition of the two bodies showed that it was Ann (whose body was considerably more decomposed) who had actually died first, and John second. This would mean that the entire estate would pass the other way round, from Ann to John, and then on to John's next of kin (herself) so she should inherit everything and Ann's daughter nothing.

Ann's daughter then counter argued that the bodies were found in two different rooms where the heat and humidity levels were not consistent. This would explain the differing rates of decomposition, so it still wasn't possible to determine the orders of death. As such statutory law should still apply meaning she should inherit everything and John's daughter nothing.

The case rumbled on until 2019 when the court finally held that the scientific evidence was inconclusive, and that therefore statutory law would have to apply. As a result Ann's daughter did inherit everything, and John's daughter inherited nothing (and having lost the case also had to pick up the court costs which had accumulated to over £150,000!)

A fascinating case which illustrates how easy it is for children to lose an inheritance, and their newly acquired step siblings to inherit everything, when a parent has entered into a second marriage.

Obituary

Tributes have been paid to a much-loved musician who's band once headlined the Royal Albert Hall. Danny Robinson, who was known as Danny Cannon as frontman for The Ramrods, has died aged 80, after a short illness.

Danny and his band members Ken Hooper, Alan Lacey, Len Beddow and Pete Walton, formed the Ramrods after becoming super fans of Buddy Holly while at school together.

They were all pupils of Etheridge SM School in Bilston, and each decided which instrument they wanted to play before splashing money on their chosen instruments.



When the band first joined up, Danny is said to have instantly wanted to be the lead singer, and to prove it bought his first microphone in 1959. Family friend lan Beddow, 53, son of the band's lead guitarist, said the successful musician always had a joke up his sleeve and never lost his smile. He said: "Danny was the joker, I never saw him miserable and he always had jokes loaded up before he went on stage, he never missed a beat and had the most impeccable memory.

"He could remember things that nobody else could, dates, times, people, places, everything. My best memory is that he always had a smile on his face."

Danny and his band had humble beginnings in the local Bilston music scene, playing small events and birthday parties. But soon their skills grew, and just



a few years after starting they were winning local music competitions including the Big Beat on Snow Hill.

Real success came when they were offered a short spot at Bilston Town Hall,

which at the time played 'Swing music' and never had any 'Rock and Roll'. The town hall gave them a chance to play during the break, but their performances became so popular they were given their own weekly slot.

Ian, said: "The legend goes that if they were on stage at 7.30pm, and you were not in the queue by 6pm, you would not be getting in.

"They went on the bill at the Royal Albert Hall because TocH - a charity set up after the war for ex servicemen who they raised money for - was part of an event playing there. "The Ramrods topped the bill and the venue was full.

He leaves behind his beloved wife Mary, son Paul and daughter Beverly.

As well as playing a small part in the first series of Peaky Blinders, Danny was also used by the series producers for his advice about local history. In an interview just before the launch of the series in 2013, he told how he taught Cillian Murphy how to speak with a correct Midland accent. He also appeared in a TV drama – Dancing on the Edge.

Bev told the magazine, "My dad was a big Wolves fan, but also attended Bilston Town FC home and away matches. He was a proper Bilstonian!

"There's a YouTube channel all about Danny Cannon and the Ramrods. Dad retired from teaching and decided to apply to work at the Black Country Living Museum. He worked there up until his 80th Birthday. Mom and Dad also celebrated 60 years of marriage in March of this year.

We have again booked Brass in Bloom to play in the amphitheatre on Sunday 7th July from 1.30pm-4 pm (in St Thomas church if raining). The number of people who say "I didn't know anything about this", well you do now, put the date in your diary, it's completely free and we even give away tea and coffee, just bring yourselves and a cushion to sit on.



The WIB Crafters have also been working hard, we sold our hand made goods at the Christmas lights switch on to boost funds and had a wreath making workshop in St Thomas's Centre with all materials provided. The spaces sold out quickly and we hope to hold the event again this December. We made hundreds of small flowers for Wightwick Manor's spring blossom art installation, and currently we are knitting hearts, which are being donated to The Swan Suite at New Cross Hospital, and to go into chemo care bags which are given out to cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy treatment.

Black Country Connected is a programme to loan residents in the Black Country a Geobook Laptop with an option to receive connectivity to enable them to access information such as health, care, social, well-being sites, general information sites, educational/college sites, social media, online shopping and connect with people/organisations via email, video call and apps.

The NHS Black Country Integrated Care Board (ICB) Digital Inequalities Programme, 'Black Country Connected', brings together people from health and care organisations as well as the community and voluntary sector. Memories of Our Wednesfield

Local Historian Ray Fellows looks back at past events that have taken place in and around our village.


Cheering crowds lined the streets awaiting the arrival of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday the 24th May 1962. A gaily decorated Alfred Squire Road, including a wonderful display of flowers in front of the council offices, welcomed the Queen on her short walk in Wednesfield during her journey from Wolverhampton to Walsall.

Moving forward 60 years we celebrated the Queens Platinum Jubilee.



On Friday 3rd June 2022 there was a celebration at the community centre and on the amphitheatre. The History Society put on a display of the Queens history from her coronation to her Platinum Jubilee. Ashmore Park, Long Knowle and Wednesfield libraries were all involved with the displays and celebrations. Some of the special guests who attended were Les Simmons, Alf and Dorothy Wardle and the Mayor Sandra Samuels and her Consort Karl.

Working with the City Library Service, the



April 2nd 1955 saw the opening of the council offices on Regal Fields.

May 14th 1955 the Library in Church Street was officially opened by Jennie Lee. The library closed some 55 years later on Saturday 22nd May 2010.

The new library in Well Lane was officially opened by the Mayor of Wolverhampton councillor Malcolm Gwinnett on the 1st June 2010.

June 6th 1961 Hylda Baker opened Sam Carpenters and Sons limited radio and Television shop at 7 High Street.

1971 The new police station in Alfred Squire Road officially opened on the 8th October 1971 by Richard C Sharples esq. The building contractors were J. F. Wooton of Bloxwich. Wednesfield Methodist Church that stood next to Pickering's shop moved to Wood End in 1983 and Trinity was demolished soon after.

W Snape and Son (Tailors) Ltd

W Snape and Son of Wednesfield origin went from strength to strength here. It was founded in a small house in New Street around 1865 by Mr James Snape who was born in 1837, the year Queen Victoria was crowned. In 1874 he moved to the old Post Office, High Street, where Mr William Snape was born; then to a shop two doors away, and in 1902 to the double fronted shop opposite Trinity Methodist Church. In 1902 Mr James Snape passed away, Mr W Snape took charge, assisted by his brother Edward.





The double fronted shop that was once Snape's Tailors from 1902, later to be Cash Bakery until the outbreak of World War 2 in 1939. In 1935 all those shops were earmarked to be demolished, today 89 years on the shops are still standing.

In 1915 they opened a shop in Wolverhampton but the Wednesfield shop was kept on for some years after this, whilst Mr Snape continued to live in Bolton Road. The house was later to be the home of Wednesfield Social Club.

All the Snape family figured largely in local social life; both church and chapel, tennis and cricket clubs. Mr W Snape; being an ardent cricketer in his earlier days, whilst for ten years he was a very active member of Wednesfield Urban District Council The success of the business was like others of Wednesfield origin. Beginning in a small way, working hard personally for long hours with plenty of pluck and initiative.

Rising pressure of business in Wolverhampton led to Snape's leaving Wednesfield; their going regretted by many but they were still interested in its welfare, especially Mr W Snape, who was very active in spite of his 78 years, he often looked up old friends.

Snape's went as a private limited company; the directors were Mr W Snape, Mr Peter Snape, his son and Mr Ted Snape his brother, the latter well remembered as a very droll comedian in local comic operettas years ago.

Norman Wisdom of stage and screen fame when first appearing at Wolverhampton Grand Theatre several years ago, was fitted by Snape's for clothes and in spite of his rise to fame, they have been his tailors ever since, in fact they went to his Barnet (Herts) home to make further fittings.


