There are a few events coming up in the next few weeks and as someone who helps to organise one of them, I know how much hard work goes on in the background, so please, if you are able, please support them and help to keep them going.

Like most people, I was shocked and saddened by the tragic death of the ex-Wolves player Diogo (not Diego!) Jota.

I never met the guy, but his age, the fact that he had only got married to his childhood sweetheart two weeks before the accident and to leave three young children without a father is just heartbreaking.

My father lost his dad in a farming accident when he was just 8 years old. He also had four younger siblings. There was no Universal Credit, oh and there was a war on. I can't imagine how they managed, but they did and Diogo's family will get through this as they have to, as we all have to in tough times.

Following on from the very successful 'Great Roof Ramble' in May, which raised a whopping £2300, the church is now planning the 'Great St Stephen's Sleepout'. The plan is to banish the vicar Revd Ros Wilshire to the roof in a 2 night sponsored sleep-over. Between Friday 1st and Sunday 3rd August, Revd Ros, accompanied by intrepid members of the congregation will be taking part in an elevated camp out on the flat roof.



Remaining on terra firma, the 4th Willenhall (St Stephen's) Scouts will also be joining in with the fun with their own sponsored camp out in the church grounds.

The weekend promises to be a great fundraising bonanza, with campfire building (and of course marshmallow toasting!), a movie night, games and activities for the children, finishing just in time for Revd Ros to climb back down and take the Sunday morning service. Refreshments will also be available throughout the weekend for anyone who wants to come along to support the fundraising effort.

Revd Ros is looking forward to the weekend with a little trepidation; "I think this may well be the first ever camp-out by a vicar on their church roof! I must admit, I'm not the best with heights, but I know it's going to be a fantastic weekend. We are really looking forward to being joined by the children of 4th Willenhall (St Stephen's) Scouts who meet regularly at the church. We hope that the community will really get behind this unique fundraising event and of course we are also praying very hard for good weather!"

As those that know their Willenhall history will know, the new St Stephens Church was consecrated in 1979, some 45 years ago. The mission statement of St Stephen's is 'To be a beacon of light in the community and to make God relevant', and the church places a high priority on serving the community and offering hospitality and a warm welcome to all. Whether it is through the weekly Stay n' Play, Place of Welcome or Pyramid Group, or the range of regular children's activities and Activity Days, everyone is welcome at St Stephen's.

Although it's a long road to raise the £63,000 needed, through a range of future fund-raising events in the pipeline along with some grant applications, St Stephen's are confident that the project will be completed by the end of the year. Once the roof has successfully been replaced and they are watertight once more, a grand reopening celebration is planned - watch this space for more details.



Willenhall Based Will Writer Jim Stanistreet, from BensonWilliams, on Protecting your Assets from Residential Care Fees



In 2022 one of my articles in this magazine was on the subject of residential care fees, and it is worth revisiting some of the points made in that article as the one question which clients continue to ask more than any other is "how can I protect my house if I have to go into residential care?"

The issue is serious. Approximately 130,000 people enter some sort of care each year, residential care can typically cost between £40,000 and £50,000 per year, and currently anybody with assets over £23,250 (including their home) has to pay for their own care.

Many people try to avoid the propblem by gifting property to thir children during their lifetime, but this is highly problematical. A child could go through a divorce, go bankrupt, or die before you, all of which would leave you exposed if your property has already been transferred to them.

Also there are strict rules on "deprivation of assets", in other words deliberately giving property away with a view to avoiding financial loss if you then need care. If your local authority believe that you have deliberately deprived yourself of

an asset they can treat you as still owning that asset when assessing you for the payment of care fees!

To protect property via your Will the time to act is when a man and wife are both still alive. One of the most common types of Will we have written for married couples over the years incorporates a "property protection trust".

This is a very simple arrangement which enables husband and wife to each leave their own half of the family home in their Will directly to their children, but subject to the condition that their spouse is allowed to remain in the home unaffected for their lifetime.

If the survivor subsequently needs care it is only their half of the property which they will be deemed to own for assessment purposes, potentially saving the family a five or six figure sum of money!

There are also a number of things which can then be done with the second half of the property, and with any cash in the estate, but these are not generic and specific advice would be needed based on individual families' immediate circumstances.

Understandably this subject is a major concern to many people, but planning ahead does dramatically reduce the impact it has on your hard earned assets.

Willenhall Pubs Wins Major Award

A popular Willenhall pub has added a major award to its already stellar reputation after being named County Pub of the Year by CAMRA.

The Robin Hood on the Crescent in Willenhall was officially named the West Midlands County Pub of the Year by the Campaign for Real Ale (CAMRA) following a number of undercover judges visiting the pub and scoring it.

The pub, which is owned by Black Country Ales, had already been named the CAMRA Walsall pub of the year for 2025 and now it has beaten pubs from Staffordshire, Shropshire, Herefordshire, Worcestershire and Warwickshire for the prize of West Midlands Pub of the Year, won in 2024 by the Bailey's Head in Oswestry.

Licensee Alex Murphy said she had heard that the pub was in the running for the award, but hadn't thought much about it until the announcement was made.

The Robin Hood has been a fixture in

Willenhall since at least 1842. Throughout the 20th century, it was run by Ansells Brewery Ltd, as well as Highgate Brewery, William Butler & Co and Mitchells & Butlers, before being taken over by Black Country Ales in 2010.

It has been run by licensee Alex Murphy since 2021 who, alongside her partner Chris Aston, who runs the cellar, and her sister Charlotte Murphy, has worked to create a pub that she said had a friendly atmosphere and more than a few great beers.

Ms Murphy said the name of the pub had been part of the appeal to take over, having lived in Nottinghamshire previously, as well as having had



a lot of past experience in the pub and hospitality industry.

She said: "Since I was a child. I've been around pubs as my mum and dad used to have a restaurant and hotel, as well as pubs, and I worked in my first pub when I was 18 and has been assistant manager for different breweries. "I've also worked abroad and I had come back and was living in Nottinghamshire, not far from the Sherwood Forest area, and I saw the pub was available, so it felt like it was meant to be.

"The pub has changed dramatically over the last four years since I came in as it was a lot smaller then, but then Black Country Ales did a huge refurbishment which really helped and has clearly shown with all the awards that we've won." "We also have a lot of different things going on here as well, such as a bike night and a quiz night, and we have the archery team in on Saturdays, as well as a regular Subbuteo league.

She said: "I put my heart and my soul into this pub and have done so since I first came here and I know that it's not a nine to five job, but more of a lifestyle than a job and I just want everything to be right. "I want my customers to feel the best when they come in, I want my house to be perfect and I need to make sure my staff are okay, because it's all about my team and everyone involved to make this pub. "As long as everyone is happy, then I'm happy."

Walsall CAMRA Chairman Ray Arrowsmith offered his own congratulations, saying: "I was pleasantly surprised as the same pub was put forward last year, but didn't even make the top three, so I think a lot of hard work has been put in by Alex, Chris and the team at the Robin Hood."



Born from a WhatsApp chat and now heading to 24 towns and cities in September, Day Fever brings affordable, joy-filled clubbing into the daylight hours. "The first one sold out in two seconds," Vicky beams. "We did Nottingham, then Sheffield, then Merthyr and Cardiff and it just flew from there."

It all started with a simple idea. "Jonny just said, 'Have you ever seen those bars in town during the day? They're rammed!" laughs Jon. "We were like, come on then, let's do it and it went nuts."

Now, this feel-good phenomenon sees people of all ages, literally from their 20s to their 70s, letting loose on packed dancefloors. "We've had Jonny's mum sneak in a bottle of gin and stash it in a bush outside in Cardiff," Jon jokes. "That's the vibe! Bit of mischief, loads of laughs, and not a bit of trouble."

And it's that warmth, spontaneity, and inclusive-

ness that keeps people coming back.

Vicky's voice lifts when she talks about the kind of people turning up to dance: "It's mothers and daughters, friends reconnecting, people on chemo, people grieving. These are your nurses, your cleaners, your teachers. These are the people keeping the world spinning and now they've got somewhere to let go and feel joy."

One story that's stayed with her is a woman who had barely seen her friends or family unless it was for a wedding or a funeral. "Now she's got a new frock every month, and she's out at Day Fever. She goes shopping Friday night, gets her hair done, and makes a proper event of it. That's magic, isn't it?"



Inclusivity isn't just a buzzword here, it's baked into the experience. "We've had people in wheel-chairs come up on stage, and the crowd goes wild. It's electric. We want it to be accessible to everyone," says Vicky, visibly moved. "It makes your hairs stand on end."

While you might catch a familiar face on the decks, Jonny, Vicky, or even Jon's wife Laura, most Day Fever events are led by local DJs. "We've been really selective," Vicky explains. "They know their crowd; they know what their people want to hear. And they're smashing it." And yes, music is taken very seriously. "There's a loose structure," Jon explains. "Bit of Northern Soul to kick off, disco, 80s bangers, 90s dance,

a singalong, maybe some indie...but we always have Whitney. If Vicky's there, it's the law."

Vicky grins, "Hits across the generations, that's the key. We've done themed nights, even Christmas clubs. And we'll ask, 'Do you want more Christmas songs?' and they're like 'nah, just give us the hits!'" She laughs. "You just get a feel for it."

Regional pride plays a part too. "Manchester goes mad for Oasis, Nottingham's got its favourites, and we make sure to tap into that local energy," says Vicky. "It's about community, about people being together."

With so many entertainment options pricing people out, Day Fever deliberately keeps things cheap. Vicky says. "We've always wanted it to be affordable. A night out can be £100 easy. We didn't want this to be that."

Jon adds, "Jonny said from day one it's for ordinary people. Families, people with kids. We're not here to rip people off."

Venues love it too. "We shut up shop at 8pm," Vicky explains, "they do a quick turnaround and run their usual night from 10. They're making great takings and reaching a new crowd. It's been a game changer for loads of clubs."

If Day Fever feels like a family party, that's because... it kind of is. "Jonny and I are married, Jon's wife DJs, his brother Chris and childhood friend Jamie are involved. Even Jonny's daughter Katie's behind the decks," Vicky laughs. "It's one big gang, and when people come through the doors, they're part of it too."



It's not uncommon to see Vicky herself dancing on stage with partygoers, selfies flying and smiles everywhere. "When people realise we're just there to have fun too, that we're not up on a pedestal, they really get into it," she says. "And I mean, come on, when do you get to go clubbing with your mum?!"

With festivals like Splendour and Reverend & The Makers' 20th anniversary show in Sheffield this summer, things are scaling up—but slowly. "We've had offers to take it abroad, but we're being really careful," Vicky says. "It's only 18 months old, it feels like a decade, but we want to make sure we look after what we've built."

They've even announced their own Day Fever festival at Nottingham's Arboretum on the 23rd August. "We've got loads of ideas," she teases. "But for now, we're just enjoying this moment. It's simple, and it works."

Even with their busy schedules, Vicky filming Trigger Point, Jon touring Australia, both say they miss it when they're away. "Sounds a bit daft," Jon chuckles, "but Day Fever cheers me up. You leave feeling lighter."

And that's the magic, really. Day Fever isn't just a disco, it's a dose of pure happiness.

Willenhall History and Heritage Society

As a society we not only have monthly meetings with selected speakers and other activities open to members and non-members, but we also do a great deal of work behind the scenes making sure everything runs smoothly. We get a lot of enquiries about Willenhall and its people from all over the world, which we usually manage to sort out. At other times we are out and about sorting out some of the problems the town has with vandalism/antisocial behaviour and keeping an eye on our very historical buildings.

This year our first meeting was on **Friday 28th February** at the Library with representatives from Walsall Council, local MPs and other parties about the town's new development and the archaeological survey.

Friday March 14th two of us went up to Stafford Archives to see Samuel Bakers Ledgers and other paperwork which of course is of great interest being as the firm stands on the land where the Levesons moated mansion stood several hundred years before, which we are very interested to see what the archaeological survey reveals.

Thursday 27th March an update for us on the running of our new and forthcoming ultramodern website.



Thursday 10th April saw us off to Rugby to see a wedding cake, definitely not an edible one but one made of locks, keys and padlocks all brass plated.

This masterpiece stands 32 inches high and 14 inches wide it took two years to complete and was built for the Great Expedition in London in 1851, more on this later.

Monday 28th April we were required for a photo shoot in Moat Street in front of what is left of the old Samuel Baker's Moat Fields Works which the BBC picked up.

Saturday 7th June saw us at Willenhall Carnival, it certainly could have been a better day weather wise but nevertheless we were able to enlighten many people who were extremely interested in the upcoming archaeological survey. We sold a fair amount of merchandise so all in all it was a good day.



Three days later we had a rather relaxing cruise on the Birmingham Canal Navigations, a bird's eye view of Birmingham from the Library and a visit to the Royal Birmingham Society of Artists at their gallery by St Pauls Square. The weather was beautiful.
